Swakopmund Township Tour	<p>5 hour tour, includes snacks and refreshments.</p> <p>Our first encounter is with a visit to either the late Damara chief, Mr. Augustinus Garoeb's family or Naftaline, a wonderful Herero lady who shares her knowledge on her culture and traditions. From there we continue on foot through the streets of Mondesa, taking the opportunity to chat with the local people and getting a fascinating glimpse into a typical Namibian township. If we have time and he is available, we stop briefly at Mr. Stanley Witbooi's house to learn about Nama traditions and herbal medicines. Then we hop back into the vehicle and drive out to the Democratic Resettlement Community (DRC). Daytime tour stops to visit a local crèche. Evening tour, we share a cup of fresh mint tea at ERNST & ELSIE'S house. Time for a drink and culinary discoveries, we stop at a local Shebeen where TASHA & Co will host you, Ovambo style! 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<p>Swakopmund City Tour</p>	<p>60 – 90 min tour.</p> <p>Where the desert dunes sweep down to the ocean on Namibia's western flank, lies the charming seaside village of Swakopmund. Swakopmund, deriving its name from the fact that it lies at the mouth of the Swakop River, is an oasis, neatly nestled between the wild Atlantic Ocean and the world's most ancient sea of sand, the Namib Desert</p> <p>This tour has no set time and lasts for as little as 60 min. The tour takes you through the old part of town, revealing its historic buildings, giving you a sense of being in old Germany. Concentrating on landmark buildings and sites one understands how Swakopmund became to be and how life was created in this endless stretch of dessert. Leaving the old part of town behind and exploring the suburbs growing around town, one becomes aware how big, diverse and ever changing this charming coastal city really is. <p>Quad biking in Swakopmund (2 Hours)</p>	<p><u>2 hour tour (38 – 55 km guided tour)</u> Departure times are flexible. Our most popular tour, as real adventure starts here, for the ride of your life. We ride the wildest dunes, roller coasters and spiral of the Namib. Excellent photographic opportunities. <p>Harbour Dolphin Cruise 3hrs</p>	<p>3 hour boat cruise, including oysters, snacks and sparkling wine</p> <p>Cruise departs Walvis Bay Yacht club at 09h00 and takes you through the harbour to Bird Island; you then cut across the lagoon to the moored Russian trawlers, where inquisitive seals will swim up to the boats looking for something to eat. From there, we head to Pelican Point where entertainment is provided by a large seal colony and pods of Heavyside and Bottlenose Dolphins swimming alongside the boats. For bird lovers, apart from seeing flamingos, cormorants and pelicans, there are common sightings of the White Chinned Petrel, Wilson's Storm Petrel, Black Oystercatcher and even the Jackass Penguin. 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<p>Namib Desert Tour Full Day</p>	<p>Full day tour including refreshments</p> <p>At 09h00am, you will be collected from your hotel. Your first destination on tour is the old steam locomotive, “Martin Luther”. Here you will hear about the history of the Namib and Swakopmund. As you pass Nonidas and other small holdings in the arid Swakop riverbed, your guide will lead you through interesting canyons to expose you to spectacular rock formations and minerals. He will also introduce you to some interesting flora, for example the Welwitschia mirabilis, the edible Nara fruit, the “Living Stones” and the Quiver tree, just to mention a few. With a bit of luck, you will be able to spot the “klispringer”, which has adapted remarkably to its harsh environment. Your next destination is Goanikontes, a desert oasis which served as a police station during colonial times. Towards the direction of the dunes, you’ll head to a look-out point at the Moon Landscape with breathtaking views, before you reach the dunes nearby Swakopmund. <p>Namib Desert Tour Half Day</p>	<p>4 hour tour from 09h00 - 13h00 or 13h00 - 16h00</p> <p>At first glance it seems impossible that the arid desert can support life. Yet it holds some of the richest lichen fields in the world and these lichens take on deeply colored hues in the morning light. We depart Swakopmund at either 09h00 or 14h00 to return at either 13h00 or 18h00 respectively. We travel to the Moon Landscape, where soft overlaying levels of earth, deposited some million years ago, were eroded to create this eerie crater filled area. In 1859 a botanist searching the Namib Desert found, what he later described “as the world’s strangest plant”. This trip goes in search of these “living fossils” the Welwitschia Mirabilis a botanic curiosity endemic to the Namib Desert and one of the most bizarre and intriguing plants on earth</p>	<p>Min 2 pax R1,025.00</p>	<p>Min 3 Pax R685.00</p>
<p>Cape Cross Seal Colony Tour</p>	<p>5 hour tour</p> <p>Depart Swakopmund at either 09h00 or 13h00 and return at either 13h00 or 17h00 respectively. In 1486 Diego Cao landed on the coast of Namibia at Cape Cross. Here, 115-km north of Swakopmund, he erected a cross in honor of King John I of Portugal. Today a replica of Diego Cao’s cross can be seen at the Cape Cross. But that’s not all - Cape Cross is one of the largest breeding seal colonies in southern Africa, fluctuating in numbers of about between 80 000 – 300 000 seals. Come and enjoy a trip to Cape Cross with an experienced guide. 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<p>Living Desert Tour</p>	<p>4 - 5 hour tour</p> <p>This half-day tour departs from Swakopmund at 08h00 and lasts 4 – 5 hours. The tour concentrates on exploring the local dune belt between Walvis Bay and Swakopmund. Special care is taken not to damage the gravel plains and cause unnecessary damage to the dune eco system. Your guide will stop continuously to look for tracks (known locally as reading the bushman newspaper), to determine which animals were active the previous night and wherever possible will try to catch some of them to show you. Great care is taken in sharing knowledge with you on each desert animal and plant, including emphasis on special adaptations and perfect design used for survival in the desert.</p>	<p>Min 2 pax</p>	<p>R685.00</p>
